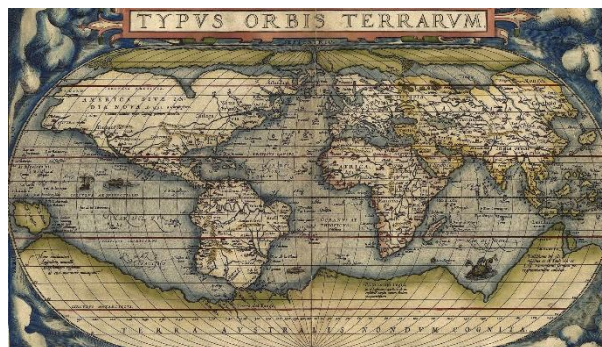
Books to support our learning.



Communication, Language & Literacy

What makes a great detective story so exciting to read?

In this topic, your children will learn how to explore short stories featuring Sherlock Holmes, focusing on clues, characters, and plot twists. They will develop their reading and analytical skills by examining how tension and mystery are created.



Maths

How do we compare quantities and understand proportions in everyday life?

In this topic, your children will learn how to use ratio to compare amounts, simplify ratios, and solve problems involving sharing and scaling. They will explore how ratio links to fractions and percentages, helping them make connections across different areas of maths. Students will also apply their understanding to real-life contexts, such as recipes, maps, and measurements.

Science

What lies beyond our planet in the vastness of space?

In this topic, your children will learn about the solar system, including planets, stars, and other celestial bodies. They will explore how gravity and movement shape the universe. Students will also investigate how humans have explored space over time.

Exploring Our World

Geography –

What is the difference between weather and climate, and why does it matter?

In this topic, your children will learn how weather patterns form and how climate varies across the world. They will explore factors that influence climate, such as latitude and altitude. Students will also consider the impact of climate on people.

Computing

How do computers follow instructions to solve problems?

History

In this topic, your children will learn about Christendom, the idea of holy warfare, and the significance of Jerusalem. They will study key events such as the First and Third Crusades and examine their causes and consequences. Students will also reflect on the long-term legacy of the Crusades.
