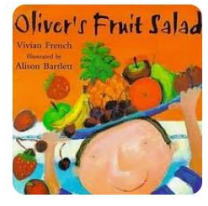
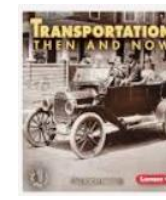
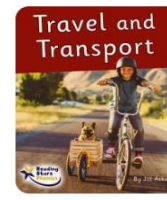
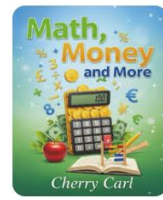
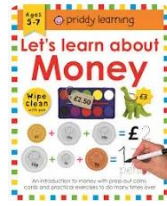
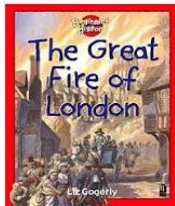


Books to support our learning.



Communication, Language & Literacy

Children will research the role of firefighters and learn how to write clear instructions for preparing equipment, using imperative verbs and fronted adverbials to make their writing more effective. They will develop their understanding of how instructions are organised and written for a specific purpose.

As their learning develops, children will study the events of the Great Fire of London, exploring what happened before, during and after the fire. They will write a recount in the role of Samuel Pepys, learning to write in the first person and using descriptive and figurative language to bring historical events to life.

Science

How do scientists and inventors help us to understand and change the world?

Children will learn about a range of significant scientists and inventors, exploring how their ideas and discoveries have helped people in the past and continue to impact our lives today. They will find out about important inventions, scientific discoveries and the ways curiosity and investigation can lead to new ideas.

PSHE, Enrichment & Ways to Wellbeing

How do we grow and change as we get older?

Children will learn about the changes that happen as people grow and develop, including physical, emotional and social changes. They will explore how their bodies and feelings may change over time and discuss ways to manage these changes positively and respectfully.

As their learning develops, children will begin to understand the importance of healthy relationships, personal hygiene and self-esteem. They will also think about how change is a natural part of life, helping them to feel confident, valued and prepared for the future.



Travel and Transport

Humanities

How has travel and transport changed over time, and how does it help people today?

Children will explore different types of transport from the past and present, learning how people travelled long ago compared with today. They will use photographs, artefacts and other sources of evidence to find out about boats, trains, cars and early attempts at flight.

As their learning develops, children will begin to understand how transport has changed over time and how these changes have made journeys quicker, safer and easier. They will also compare journeys from the past with their own experiences.

Therapeutic Input

Every other Wednesday, Seals will have the opportunity to take part in Rebound Therapy at our Alnwick site. Rebound therapy is a specialized, therapeutic exercise program using trampolines to improve movement, balance and muscle tone whilst being lots of fun!

Numeracy & Problem Solving

Children will learn to recognise and use British coins and notes, developing confidence in counting and comparing different amounts of money. They will practise adding amounts together and working out change through practical, real-life problems and activities.

Some children will apply their understanding of money to simple business activities, including designing their own shop or product. They will explore ideas such as profit, loss and value for money, helping them to understand how maths is used in everyday spending and decision-making.

Computing

How is technology used in our everyday life?

Children will explore different types of technology used at home, in school and in the wider world. They will learn to recognise common digital devices and begin to understand how technology helps people in their daily lives. such as logging in, navigating digital programs and creating basic digital content.

The Arts

How can we prepare healthy and tasty foods safely?

Children will learn about different fruits and vegetables and begin to understand why healthy eating is important. They will explore where foods come from, identify ingredients used in salads and discuss different tastes, textures and colours.

They will also design and make their own salad creations!

Physical Education

How can we use music and dance to express ideas and feelings?

Children will explore different ways of moving their bodies through dance, learning to travel, jump, turn and balance with increasing control and confidence. They will respond to music and rhythms, practising how to move safely and creatively in different ways. As their learning develops, children will begin to link movements together to create simple dance sequences and perform them with others. They will also explore how dance can be used to express moods, stories and ideas, helping them to build confidence, coordination and teamwork skills.
